DuBrock, class of 1971, earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Wildlife Biology and Ecology from Michigan State University in 1977, and a Master of Science Degree in Wildlife Management from Virginia Polytechnic Institute & State University in 1980. In addition, he has completed postgraduate coursework in public policy and public administration at Penn State University.
