



Jennifer Newton, Class of 2003, earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in both Criminology & Psychology from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 2007. In 2013, Jennifer earned a Masters of Science Degree in Recreation, Parks and Tourism from Western Illinois University. In 2016, Jennifer completed her Doctorate of Philosophy Degree in Recreation, Park and Tourism Management, & Human Dimensions of Natural Resources and the Environment. She is currently a social scientist with the National Park Service stationed in Grand Teton National Park in Wyoming.

Beginning in 2007, Jennifer served in the Peace Corps for two years in Senegal, Africa. She then lived in China for a year and a half teaching high school and college students English. As a doctoral student, Dr. Newton was the principle investigator for multiple studies examining visitor use, experience and preferences in the Moose-Wilson corridor of the park, presented research and results at the Northeastern Recreational Research Symposium, the George Wright Society and Jinan Tourism Conferences.
